

YWA Materials: Please purchase the following.

- 1. A THREE-RING BINDER serves as the student's organization station—ideal for taking notes (on loose-leaf pages), filing emailed handouts, storing HW, etc.
- 2. In a personalized, customized, just-as-you-like-it JOURNAL, each student will write JE = Journal Entry HW = homework to submit to Mrs. Amy for grading.
- 3. **NOTECARDS** serve as an aid to:
 - Memorize terms (like POS = parts of speech; labels used for DS = diagramming sentences; etc.)
 - Review spelling words

Academic Vision:

- 1. Attend & participate—irresistibly easy —during class!
- 2. Take class notes.
- 3. Complete HW = homework.
- 4. Take in-class tests.
- 5. Choose to do optional level-up challenges:
 - a. Follow challenge-level directions when given by Mrs. Amy on tests.
